NCS Meeting Brampton Museum, Newcastle under Lyme, Staffs ST5 0QP

A new venue for the NCS, but one with plenty of ceramic interest with the morning's presentation covering a subject area that will be new to some members. Newcastle under Lyme plays an important part in the history of the ceramics and the foundation of North Staffordshire as a world leader in ceramics production and expertise. Often thought of as a residential suburb of the Potteries, the Manor of Newcastle was created in the early 13th century and subsequently was important to the economic prosperity of the area, not least through association with pioneers of the ceramics industry, notably in the 18th century.

Collections Project Officer at Brampton Museum Miranda Goodby, former Curator of Ceramics at the Potteries Museum, introduces us to **250 years of pottery making in Newcastle-under-Lyme** and viewing of excavated sherds in the Brampton Museum collection.

In the afternoon we have a members' presentation with Keith & Alison Morley who are reprising their **Lancaster Delftware** presentation from our study day in June by popular demand. Great insight into features of Lancaster Delftware production based on the Morleys' close observation of the of excavated shards and extant pieces is shared with members. A video of Yorkshire potter and NCS member John Hudson re-creating Delftware will round off the day's presentations.
